

AMBITION-cm phase III clinical trial launched in Botswana



Almost twenty per cent of HIV-related deaths are directly attributable to cryptococcal meningitis (CM). The AMBITION-cm project was developed to evaluate a new treatment course. In January 2017, the EDCTP grant agreement for the study with a total value of almost €10 million was signed. The AMBITION-cm project is coordinated by Dr Joseph Jarvis of the London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine, United Kingdom.

European Open Science Cloud (EOSC) Summit



The meeting in Brussels, Belgium on 12 June 2017, was meant as Europe's moment of commitment to the EOSC. The Summit gathered approximately 100 high-level decision makers from ministries of research, universities, research institutions, and other organisations involved in research across Europe. The Summit was convened to provide commitment to the European Open Science Cloud as an open commons for Europe's research and innovation.

opened the event and outlined his vision for a structure, where "researchers should be able to access all publicly funded research data in a single click".


Dr Ole Olesen, Director of North-North Cooperation: "In many aspects EDCTP is taking a pioneering role in regards to the EOSC for clinical trial data. EDCTP requires all research data from the clinical trials it funds, to be openly available and shared with third parties. Therefore we are establishing a portal, or single entry point, that will allow researchers to easily deposit, share and retrieve clinical trial data. Furthermore, EDCTP is taking steps towards the establishment of a new platform that will allow clinical researchers to share and develop clinical trial protocols with feedback from the wider scientific community ".
