Results from VAC047 malaria vaccine trial carried out by EDCTP-funded MVVC

The results were published in PlosOne on 15

December 2016. VAC047 trial which tested the efficacy of ChAd63-MVA ME-TRAP prime-boost vaccination against *P. falciparum* infection in 120 healthy adult males in Senegal, was conducted between July 2012 and March 2013. This study was followed by a larger efficacy trial (VAC050, n=730)



conducted in Burkina Faso in infants. Publication of VAC050 results is expected soon.
