## News

### San code of research ethics presented at Trust meeting

The South African San Institute together with the South African San Council launched the first [San code of research ethics](#) to avoid future exploitation within research of the San community. The launch took place on 2 March 2017 in Cape Town, South Africa, during the TRUST meeting. TRUST is a global ethics consortium funded from the Horizon 2020 in which EDCTP participates.



The TRUST global ethics consortium held a plenary meeting for its members in Kalk Bay, Cape Town, South Africa from 28 February to 2 March 2017. Along with all TRUST partners, three TRUST advisors (Professor Olga Kubur, Paul Woodgate and Professor David Morton) participated. EDCTP was represented by Dr Michelle Singh.



The two-day plenary included interactive sessions on topics of fair research collaborations, partnerships and contracts as well as benefit sharing in practice.

## TB clinical studies: launch of PanACEA2 and Predict-TB



PanACEA2 meeting

Two new clinical studies had their kick-off meeting in Cape Town, South Africa, in March 2017. EDCTP Senior Project Officer, Dr Monique Rijks-Surette participated in both meetings.

On 7-8 March, the **PanACEA** consortium launched its second clinical trials programme for TB-drug evaluation. The project, led by Professor Martin Boeree (Radboud University, Nijmegen, The Netherlands) aims to develop at least two promising TB-treatment regimens with

sound prediction data for a successful phase III evaluation, and advance one new agent into a phase IIB trial. EDCTP will invest almost €11.4 million. [Read more](#)

**Predict-TB**, led by Professor Gerhard Walzl of Stellenbosch University, had its launch meeting on 16-17 March. EDCTP will invest €7.7 million in the project that investigates biomarkers in order to predict TB treatment outcome, which are ultimately to be used in a point-of-care test. Such a test could help shortening TB treatment for many patients. [Read more](#)

- **WHO | Tuberculosis:** Consensus meeting on Target Product Profile (TPP) and Framework for Evaluation for a test of progression to active tuberculosis (Geneva, Switzerland, 8 February 2017). EDCTP Operations Manager Dr Pauline Beattie participated in the meeting.
