

World AIDS Day 2018

This 2018 World AIDS Day marks its 30th anniversary. Significant progress has been made in the fight against the disease during these three decades. However, the <u>Global AIDS</u> <u>Update 2018 report</u> 'Miles to go' shows that much needs to be done to reach the 2020 targets. According to the report, 'new HIV infections are rising, HIV-related deaths are not falling fast enough and flat resources are threatening success'.

Over the last 15 years, EDCTP has achieved significant progress in bringing together researchers and institutions in Europe and Africa to advance medical interventions against HIV. EDCTP-funded studies on HIV have made vital contributions, for example, to the development of antiretroviral drug formulations tailored to children and facilitating their widespread introduction in Africa. PredART | results published in NEJM | 14 November 2018

The results of the PredART clinical trial co-funded by EDCTP were <u>published in the New</u> <u>England Journal of Medicine</u> on 14 November 2018. Prof. Graeme Meintjes (University of Cape Town) and his team showed that a moderate dose of prednisone given over four weeks to patients with HIV-TB co-infection most at risk of developing TB IRIS, reduces their risk by 30%. The results have already influenced national and international guidelines for managing HIV-TB co-infection.

LusoAfro-BioEthics | public project launch in Mozambique | 23 November 2018

The public launch of the EDCTP-funded project "LusoAfro-BioEthics - Strengthening Bioethics Committees in Lusophone African Region" (coordinated by Prof. Maria Rosário Oliveira Martins, Institute of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine - University NOVA of Lisbon) was held in Maputo at the Ministry of Health of Mozambique. The ceremony was presided over by the Deputy Minister of Health, PhD João Leopoldo da Costa.

Participants in this event were members of the Mozambique National Bioethics Committee, IHMT-NOVA Deputy Director, researchers from UniCV and UAN (Angola), Deputy National Directors of the Ministry of Health, researchers and members of the eight Mozambique institutional committees.

CANTAM | EDCTP visit | 29-31 October 2018

EDCTP visits are made to countries where substantial financial investments have been made. The visits are an excellent opportunity to discuss how standards in project implementation, documentation, reporting and financial control can be met. The Republic of Congo has seen an increase in the number of EDCTP-funded projects which has attracted more than 4,977,244 Euro to the country since 2004. This visit aimed to assess the scientific and financial management capacity of <u>CANTAM</u>, the Central Africa Network on Tuberculosis, HIV/AIDS and Malaria. The objective was to ensure that the project and its sites improve or maintain compliance with contractual obligations and can stand a test of future independent audits or assessments.

An EDCTP team, Project Officer <u>Michelle Nderu</u> and <u>Mary Jane Coloma-Egelink</u>, Grants Finance Officer, visited the CANTAM coordinating research institute Fondation Congolaise pour la Recherche Médicale (FCRM) and its partner sites in Congo from 29 to 31 October 2018.

Institut Pasteur | International Network symposium | 15-16 November 2018

On 15-16 November 2018, <u>Dr Ole Olesen</u>, EDCTP Director of International Cooperation (Europe) and EDCTP Project Officer <u>Jean Marie Vianney Habarugira</u> attended the 4th edition of the Institut Pasteur International Network Symposium held in Paris. The theme of this year's edition was <u>Combating Resistance: microbes and vectors</u>, an area which fits EDCTP's mission, considering the growing public health threat caused by resistance to treatment of infections including bacterial infections, malaria, HIV/AIDS and tuberculosis.

On 16 November, the poster session featured part of the work JMH Habarugira is carrying out in collaboration with the Autonomous University of Barcelona, exploring the potential role of pharmacovigilance intelligence systems in tracking antimicrobial resistance. The symposium featured several presentations from Pasteur institutions with EDCTP-funded projects, including Institut Pasteur de Dakar, Centre Pasteur du Cameroun, Institut Pasteur de Bangui, Institut Pasteur de Cote d'Ivoire and Institut Pasteur du Madagascar.
