









Dr Detlef Böcking steps down as EDCTP General Assembly representative and technical advisor for Germany

The EDCTP Association would like to express its sincere appreciation to Dr Detlef Böcking, who will in April 2023 be stepping down from his position as Head of Group at the DLR project management agency (DLR PT) working for and on behalf of the German Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF), Division of Health Research. Since 2009, Dr Böcking has been charged to represent the ministry in EDCTP as deputy representative to EDCTP's General Assembly (GA) for Germany, having already been involved in EDCTP activities since 2007. In September 2022 he stepped down as deputy GA representative and continued serving as a technical advisor for Germany. He has coordinated DLR PT's team for global health issues and worked closely with BMBF in planning and implementing the ministry's activity in research for Global Health, particularly in administering the ministry's funding concept for neglected and poverty-related diseases.

World TB Day 2023: Yes! We can end TB

On this year's World TB Day, EDCTP joined its global partners in the belief that we can end the tuberculosis epidemic. The urgency is clear, as TB has reclaimed its position as the leading cause of death from a single infectious agent after COVID-19 briefly overtook it. High-level leadership, increased research investment, concerted action and reducing health inequities are key ingredients to achieve the complex but attainable goal to end TB.

"People underestimate the burden TB has on our societies, leading to a belief that TB is not as serious as other respiratory diseases such as COVID-19 and other causes of pneumonia. That is an illusion."




Second interim evaluation report: EDCTP2 highly relevant in the EU and globally

Recent events

EDCTP site visit Côte d'Ivoire



Mr Abdoulie Barry, Dr Pauline Beattie and Dr Thomas Nyirenda visited Abidjan to review the progress of EDCTP projects in Côte d'Ivoire, including projects based at <u>PAC-CI</u>, Université Félix Houphouët Boigny, Le Centre Suisse de Recherches Scientifiques en Côte d'ivoire, and Ministère de la Santé, de l'Hygiène Publique et de la Couverture Maladie Universelle.

Côte d'Ivoire is a partner in 14 EDCTP projects, ranging from HIV research, emerging diseases, neglected infectious diseases through to ethics and regulatory capacity strengthening. EDCTP staff met with project staff to assess progress and to review the institutional, technical and financial management of EDCTP projects.

EDCTP staff had the privilege to meet with Mr Pierre N'Gou Dimba, the Minister of Health. Mr Dimba declared his interest and support for EDCTP, and his intention to encourage and build upon the success of EDCTP research projects in Côte d'Ivoire.

Pediatric Praziquantel Consortium: Phase III results in The Lancet Infectious Diseases



The Pediatric Praziguantel Consortium have published the results of the phase III trial of arpraziguantel, a new pediatric medication to treat schistosomiasis in preschool-aged children, in The Lancet Infectious Diseases. Arpraziguantel, a firstline orodispersible tablet, showed high efficacy and favourable safety in preschool-aged children with schistosomiasis. A linked commentary was delivered by Guo-Jing Yang and Xiao-Nong Zhou under the title 'A new formulation of praziguantel to achieve schistosomiasis elimination'. In December 2022, the European Medicines Agency (EMA) validated for review the application for this new treatment option. With this validation, the regulatory application for arpraziguantel is complete and EMA will begin the scientific review

process.

IMPROVE: new antimalarial better tolerated, safer and more effective



Results from the **IMPROVE** project confirm that dihydroartemisinin-piperaquine (DP), a new antimalarial, is better tolerated, safer, and more effective in treating and preventing malaria infections in pregnancy than current WHO-recommended treatment (i.e. sulphadoxine-pyrimethamine, SP), but does not improve birth outcomes. IMPROVE is a multi-country clinical trial comparing the efficacy. safety and tolerance of monthly IPTp-SP (control) versus monthly IPTp-DP (new treatment), alone or combined with a single course of azithromycin at enrolment to reduce the adverse effects of malaria and curable STIs/RTIs in 4,680 pregnant women and their newborns in sub-Sahara Africa. The study took place in 12 hospitals in highly malarious areas with high SP resistance in western Kenya, northern Tanzania, and southern Malawi. The results were published in The Lancet.

PROTID annual meeting



On 27-28 February 2023 the <u>PROTID</u> consortium held their first face-to-face meeting since the COVID-19 pandemic in Moshi, Tanzania. The PROTID (Preventive Treatment of Latent Tuberculosis Infection in people with Diabetes Mellitus) project addresses a key EDCTP prevention priority area, namely TB and comorbidities. In 2022, the project initiated the first randomised controlled trial globally that evaluates the efficacy and impact of preventive treatment of latent tuberculosis infection (LTBI) in people living with diabetes.

SIMBLE: Laboratory-on-a-ship



The SIMBLE project will conduct a clinical diagnostic trial in Western Africa of a simplified blood culture system to improve healthcare in low-resource settings. To this end, a large shipping container was refurbished to be used as microbiology media production unit developed for local production. In an article in <u>The Lancet Microbe</u> "Laboratory-on-a-ship: a microbiology culture media production facility in a sea container for local production in low-resource settings" the process is described of developing, constructing and installing the microbiology

production container in Cotonou, Benin.

As part of a TB vaccine <u>coordination project</u> implemented by the TuBerculosis Vaccine Initiative (TBVI), an EDCTP online directory with an <u>overview of</u> <u>clinical trial sites in sub-Saharan Africa</u> is available. The directory includes the capacity of the clinical trial sites to conduct TB vaccine trials. In collaboration with sub-Saharan African clinical research sites, TBVI has updated the directory. SCEPRESSA: EPI-Biostat Fellows field visits in Kenya and Malawi



Strengthening Capacity for Epidemics Preparedness and Response in sub-Saharan Africa (SCEPRESSA), one out of <u>10 EPI-Biostat</u> <u>consortia supported by EDCTP and Africa CDC</u>, conducted field visits in Kenya and Malawi between November 2022 and February 2023. SCEPRESSA Master of Science Epidemiology and Biostatistics Fellows 'learn by doing', hence the two-year training will comprise 25% blended didactic sessions and 75% practical, in-the-field mentored training. During the field visits, the Fellows were exposed to various research activities that provided opportunities to network with researchers in partnering institutions.

On 20-21 March 2023, the Virtual Research Ethics Secretariat of the BCA-WA-ETHICS II project organised the training course "Understanding and Applying Gender and Sex Approaches in Research Ethics" for Niger's National Research Ethics Committee (CNERS). The training, which brought together nine CNERS members, coved topics such as the fundamentals of gender and sex, their role as health determinants, the integration of gender and sex into research, and the application of CNERS's new protocol evaluation tools which were conceived by the Virtual Research Ethics Secretariat.

EACCR3: Handover of REC office Jinja Regional Referral Hospital



On 23 March 2023, the Eastern Africa Consortium for Clinical Research (EACCR3) handed over the Research and Ethics Committee (REC) office at the Jinja Regional Referral Hospital (JRRH) in Eastern Uganda. The process started in June 2022 with a meeting between Uganda Virus Research Institute (UVRI)/EACCR and Jinja RRH. During that meeting, the scientific liaison officer, Dr Bernard Kikaire, shared the vision and objectives of EACCR. He emphasised the importance of strengthening the conduct of ICH-GCP compliant research in the region and the need to have functional ethical regulatory committees at the Regional Referral Hospitals.
