- Increase **health security** in sub-Saharan Africa and globally, by strengthening the research- and innovation-based capacities for preparedness and response to control infectious diseases.



Mission

To support global collaborative research, capacity strengthening, and international initiatives to accelerate the development, evaluation, and implementation of interventions to prevent, identify, and treat infectious diseases including emerging/re-emerging infections in SSA to reduce overall mortality and morbidity.




Scope



for 15 grants supporting coordination and strengthening institutional capacities and the enabling environment for conducting clinical trials and clinical research




With a planned budget of €210 million from the 2024 calls for proposals, close to 33 new projects will start in the coming months









Participation in Global Health EDCTP3

- Horizon Europe associated countries eligible to receive Global Health EDCTP3 funding
- Countries participating in Global Health EDCTP3-funded grants but not eligible to receive funding
- Countries not participating and not eligible to receive Global Health EDCTP3 funding



Role and responsibilities

The role of Global Health EDCTP3 JU

- Granting authority, following the Joint Undertaking EU regulations and laws
 - Horizon Europe grants
- Operations
- Research and development of the annual Work Programmes based on the SRIA and Global Health priorities
- Call for Proposals and Grant management: running evaluations, closing grant agreements with with the beneficiaries, project monitoring, payments and ex-post
- Programme office to the governance structure
- Monitoring the implementation of the Work Programmes and the Strategic Innovation Agenda (SRIA)
- Partnership building, collaboration with the key global players
- Works in collaboration with its Members: The European Union (represented by the European Commission) and the EDCTP Association


