**Twelfth EDCTP Forum: Overview and highlights** 



The Twelfth EDCTP Forum is just around the corner, taking place from 15-20 June 2025 in Kigali, Rwanda. With an impressive turnout expected of over 1,200 participants, this Forum promises to be a cornerstone event for health researchers dedicated to tackling poverty-related and neglected infectious diseases.

The comprehensive <u>programme</u> is now available online, featuring a rich array of topics in the scope of EDCTP. Participants can look forward to engaging <u>plenary sessions</u> featuring <u>distinguished guests and leading speakers</u>, who are recognised authorities in their respective fields of research.

In addition to the plenary sessions, the Forum's scientific programme includes <u>parallel</u> <u>sessions</u> and poster presentations in the scope of EDCTP. <u>Scientific symposia</u> and <u>sponsored satellite sessions</u>, organised by research groups or organisations, will foster interactive discussions that encourage the exchange of ideas among participants.

<u>Thursday 19 June</u> has become a particularly enriching component of the Forum programme, featuring a series of captivating scientific symposia, workshops, and side meetings. This unique opportunity allows participants to explore relevant topics in depth and engage in training sessions designed to enhance their skills and knowledge as researchers.

For young researchers, the 'Meet the Experts' sessions are not to be missed. These gatherings are tailored for junior to mid-career scientists to network with leading experts in poverty-related and neglected infectious diseases. Participants will have the chance to engage in informal discussions, pose questions, and gain insights that could shape their research journeys. Registrations for the 'Meet the Experts' session will open soon.

Networking is at the heart of the Twelfth EDCTP Forum, with dedicated spaces for one-on-one or small group meetings, which participants can schedule through the Forum's networking app. Additionally, participants can engage in mentoring meetings, enabling early- and mid-career researchers to connect with experienced professionals. This initiative serves as a valuable networking platform, fostering connections that can significantly benefit those in the early stages of their careers.

## **EDCTP Association at the Twelfth EDCTP Forum**

The EDCTP Association is collaborating with Global Health EDCTP3 to organise the Twelfth

EDCTP Forum. Beyond its essential logistical contributions, the Association is actively involved in the Forum's programme, participating in multiple sessions across various days of the event.

On Tuesday, 17 June, a <u>session led by Dr Pauline Beattie</u> will focus on the results of a bibliometric analysis of the EDCTP2 programme. This session will also highlight other significant impacts of the EDCTP2 programme, providing participants with a thorough understanding of the programme's contributions to global health.

Subsequently, on 19 June, the <u>EDCTP Africa Office will host a workshop</u> aimed at fostering collaboration among funders dedicated to developing global health scientific leaders. The objectives of this session include:

- 1. Presenting the funding priorities of various organisations.
- 2. Exploring opportunities for alignment and complementarity between different fellowship programmes.
- 3. Facilitating interaction among past, current, and prospective fellows supported by various funding initiatives.
- 4. Offering a platform for feedback from beneficiaries regarding the effectiveness of their programmes.

Furthermore, the same day will feature a <u>workshop in collaboration with MMV</u> designed to inspire researchers by illustrating the crucial role of communication in scientific success. Participants will discover that effective communication transcends mere soft skills; it is vital for achieving impact in science, particularly in the conduct of clinical trials and the overall drug development process. Those who embrace the power of communication can transform a good career into a remarkable one.

## Remembering Dr Louis K. Penali (1953-2025)



We are greatly saddened by the passing of Dr Louis K. Penali, a distinguished member of the EDCTP General Assembly for Côte d'Ivoire and a key figure in the field of health research. Dr Penali served as the Chair of the National Health Research Committee within the Ministry of Health of Côte d'Ivoire.

Renowned as one of West Africa's leading researchers, Dr Penali dedicated his career to enhancing research capacity throughout the region. His unwavering commitment to ethics and community engagement established vital foundations for conducting excellent research.

Dr Penali led several EDCTP projects aimed at building ethics capacity and sharing expertise among researchers in West Africa.

# New antiretroviral combinations show promise for children living with HIV



The CHAPAS-4 trial has presented important advancements in second-line antiretroviral therapy for children living with HIV. Published in the *New England Journal of Medicine*, the trial results show that new antiretroviral combinations, specifically tenofovir alafenamide (TAF) and dolutegravir (DTG), are superior to older second-line options such as abacavir (ABC) or zidovudine (ZDV) plus lamivudine (3TC).

# HAT-r-ACC: First oral treatment for deadly sleeping sickness now available in Africa



Fexinidazole Winthrop, the first all-oral treatment for *Trypanosoma brucei (T.b.)* rhodesiense sleeping sickness, an acute form of the disease, is now available free of charge to patients in specialised treatment centres in Ethiopia, Malawi, Tanzania, Zambia, and Zimbabwe. Clinical trials conducted by the HAT-r-ACC consortium have led to Fexinidazole Winthrop's approval.
