## **Congratulations to Dr Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus**

## Senegal: new health research institute IRESSEF

Senegal will officially launch a new health research institute, the Institut de la recherche en santé, surveillance épidemiologique et de Formation (IRESSEF) [Institute for Health, Research, Epidemiological Surveillance, and Training] on 19 June 2017.

The institute has the ambition to become a hub for health research, surveillance and training in Africa. The launch will be presided over by the President of Senegal, His Excellency Macky Sall. EDCTP will be represented by its Executive Director, Dr Michael Makanga, who will contribute a speech to the opening session for the launch of the institute.

Connected to the launch is an international symposium from 19-20 June 2017. The symposium will cover 'Building partnerships to advance surveillance responses to disease threats, laboratory quality management systems and access to quality diagnostics, and public health research in Africa'.

On 21 June, the kick-off meeting of WANETAM will take place. WANETAM, the West African Network of Excellence for TB, AIDS and Malaria is one of the original four EDCTP networks created to build capacity for clinical trials on HIV, TB and malaria. The network started its activities on 31 July 2009 and it enters now a new phase. <a href="Michelle Nderu">Michelle Nderu</a>, EDCTP Project Officer will attend the kick-off.
