PanACEA2 | 1st Annual General Assembly meeting | Cape Town, South Africa, 28 February-1 March 2018 | PanACEA2 is a consortium with the task to execute a programme consisting of three clinical trials:

- **HIGHRIF**: It's aim is to optimise the dose of rifampicin by continuation of the previous maximum tolerated dose study of rifampicin;
- **14+14 SMART** trial: It's aim is to assess the safety and efficacy of Q203 and BTZ043 which is expected to enter the clinical phase later in the programme. These compounds will be evaluated with novel mechanisms of activity through an innovative phase study design, '14+14' phase IIA SMART (Sequential, Multiple Assignment, Randomized Trial).
- **STEP** trial: The aim of tis study is to evaluate several combinations of the optimal doses of rifampicin, Q203, and an optimised dose of pyrazinamide of 40 mg/kg complemented by isoniazid and ethambutol, in a six-arm study using the novel STEP design (the Phase IIC Selection Trial with Extended Post-treatment follow-up). This closes the gap between Phase II and Phase III studies.

This work programme aims for a result of at least two promising regimens with sound prediction data for a successful phase III evaluation. Dr Monique Surette, EDCTP Senior Project Officer, will participate in the meeting.
