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Report of Lisbon meeting on next EDCTP programme



EDCTP organised a high-level meeting on the character, scope and shape of its next programme in Lisbon, Portugal, on 17 September 2018. Approximately 100 participants representing EDCTP member countries and strategic partners in global health participated to discuss their involvement in EDCTP and their views on its future development. SELeCT | results to date | 12 November 2018

Interesting <u>overview of results</u> (including publications) of the SELeCT project which aimed to strengthen research capacity in Liberia and was conducted from early 2016 to mid 2017.

Lansana, director of the Saint Joseph's Catholic Hospital of Monrovia, Liberia on the ISGlobal website. He reflects on his experience with the introduction of research in the hospital through research capacity building projects: "SELeCT and IGORCADIA were eye-openers for the staff, for myself. These two projects have helped us better understand the need to fully participate in research activities."

ARA trial | start of recruitment | 1 December 2018

Preparation for the ARA - Adolescents' Retention and Adherence Trial has been ongoing since June 2018. The trial is funded via an EDCTP Career Development Fellowship (TMA2016CDF-1548) and aims to study 'Conditional economic incentives and motivational interviewing to improve adolescents' retention and adherence to antiretroviral therapy in south-east Nigeria' through a cluster randomised trial. The study is coordinated by fellow Dr Obinna Ekwunife at the Nnamdi Azikiwe University in Awka, Nigeria The ARA trial started recruitment of patients on 1 December 2018. The trial makes use of 12 trial sites (HIV treatment hospitals) and 36 health professionals. A team comprising a doctor, nurse or pharmacist and a laboratory technologist work to implement the trial at each trial site. A one-day central training on good clinical laboratory practice for the laboratory technologists was organised before recruitment as part of trial preparation.

Ethics in Sudan | results presented | 5-7 December 2018

Results of one of the EDCTP 2015 Ethics and Regulatory Capacities projects were presented at the <u>14th World Congress of Bioethics</u> / 7th National Bioethics Conference in Bangalore, India, from 5-7 December 2018. Programme here (<u>PDF download</u>).Dr Shaza Abass (Coordinator) and Dr Shahd Osman presented results from the grant 'Enhancing Ethics in Sudan' (CSA2015ERC-873). Dr Abass presented an 'Assessment of the capacity of higher education institutes in Sudan' and Dr Osman had a poster presentation titled 'A review of the national guidelines for research ethics in Sudan'.

Online Manual. Already among the reference documents, the Code was recently moved from 'General guidance' documents to 'Rules & and codes of conduct' documents. The <u>Global code</u> is available in Chinese, English, French, German, Hindi, Japanese, Portuguese, Russian, and Spanish on the <u>dedicated</u> website for the code.

TRUST produced a <u>policy brief on healthy volunteers in clinical trials</u>, written by Dr François Bompart (DND*i*) and Dr Francesca Irene Cavallaro (consultant for the UNESCO Bioethics and Ethics of Science and Technology section). Among other things, the TRUST group "Recommends National Healthy Volunteer

Registries to significantly reduce risks for healthy volunteers by monitoring repeated involvement of healthy volunteers in clinical trials."

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Recent events

Dakar, Senegal | EDCTP visit | 29-31 October 2018

EDCTP visits are made to countries where substantial financial investments have been made. The visits are an excellent opportunity to discuss how standards in project implementation, documentation, reporting and financial control can be met.

Nuffield Council on Bioethics | data & sample sharing | 3-4 December 2018

The Nuffield Council on Bioethics - an independent body funded by the Nuffield Foundation, MRC UK and the Wellcome Trust - organised a meeting on sharing research data and samples during emergencies. The Nuffield working group on data and sample sharing during emergencies had invited five external speakers including Prof. Moses Bockarie (EDCTP Director of International Cooperation Africa) for a two day discussion on how fair collaboration can be established. This was approached from the perspective of the donors/sources of the data in the trying circumstances of an emergencies, and from the perspective of the researchers and health professionals. Currently, EDCTP supports several projects and consortia whose work is relevant to the discussion: ALERRT, PANDORA-ID Net, Networks of Excellence and EDCTP's support for strengthening national ethics and regulatory authorities.

ASLM | ASLM 2018 conference |10-13 December 2018

The <u>African Society for Laboratory Medicine</u> held its <u>fourth biennial conference</u> in Abuja, Nigeria from 10-13 December 2018. Dr Michael Makanga, EDCTP Executive Director, was a speaker at the opening ceremony on 10 December. Prof. M. Bockarie (EDCTP Director of International Cooperation Africa) co-chaired a

session on <u>Africa Regional Laboratory Networks: perspective on emerging diseases threats</u> and presented on EDCTP's experience in establishing regional research networks.

NEPAD | AMRH week in Kigali, Rwanda | 10-14 December 2018



NEPAD, the implementation agency of the African Union, organised the <u>African Medicines Regulatory Harmonization (AMRH) week in Kigali,</u> <u>Rwanda</u>. The AMRH initiative is currently evaluated in view of further regulatory harmonisation in Africa and the establishment of the African Medicines Authority. AMRH Week focused on on-going work around alignment arrangements of different partners, stakeholders, networks and similar initiatives towards regulatory harmonisation. EDCTP was represented at this high-Level event by Dr Michael Makanga (Executive Director) and Dr Leonardo Simão (High Representative 'Africa).

CIPHER, the Collaborative Initiative for Paediatric HIV Education and Research. an IAS programme, launched its <u>'Growing the Leaders of Tomorrow Fellowship Programme'</u> in 2017 "to build and support clinical research leadership in paediatric and adolescent HIV in low- and middle-income countries, particularly high-burden countries in sub-Saharan Africa."

"CIPHER Fellows are medical practitioners from sub-Saharan Africa with clinical research experience and the potential to become the next generation of leaders in paediatric and adolescent HIV clinical science. Each fellow receives \$70,000 over two years, and has already linked with a potential mentor. The mentor is an internationally renowned researcher in paediatric and adolescent HIV with an established clinical research collaboration based at an institute of excellence in sub-Saharan Africa." **Application deadline: 07 January 2019**

MRC UK | Joint Global Health Trials scheme - call 9 | Development Grants

The UK Department for International Development (DFID), the UK Medical Research Council (MRC), the National Institute for Health Research (NIHR) and Wellcome Trust are pleased to announce the launch of the <u>ninth call for proposals under this initiative</u> to fund global health trials. Call opens 14 November 2018 and closes 05 February 2019.

JPIAMR | Call on Diagnostics and surveillance | 2019

From the call text: "The Call on Diagnostics and Surveillance 2019 will fund joint transnational research projects addressing the development of diagnostic and surveillance tools, technologies and methods to detect antimicrobial resistance (AMR). Projects should address the diagnosis of AMR infections in clinical and veterinary settings, or the surveillance of AMR in humans, animals and the environment. The call promotes projects with impact in low and middle income countries (LMICs) in Asia and Africa." The call opened on 05 December and the submission deadline for pre-proposals is 18 February 2018.

About the <u>Joint Programming Initiative on Anti-Microbial Resistance</u>. The call was opened up to researchers from Africa and Asia through funding from the <u>Swedish International Development</u> <u>Agency</u> (Sida) and the <u>International Development Research Centre Canada</u> (IDRC Canada), respectively. Sida and IDRC Canada <u>agreed in November 2018 to a new partnership</u> to boost research in sub-Saharan Africa through contributions to the <u>Science Granting Councils Initiative</u> in Sub-Saharan Africa (SGCI).

MRC UK/GCRF/NHS | Global Maternal and Neonatal Health |2019

From the pre-call announcement: "The purpose of the call is to address the burden of maternal and neonatal mortality and morbidity in low and middle-income countries (LMIC), by funding high-quality proposals across the spectrum of basic to applied research. Awards will support multidisciplinary research, build and strengthen research partnerships, and promote capacity building in global maternal and neonatal health research. Applications are particularly encouraged from principal investigators based at organisations in LMIC, as well as from eligible research organisations based in the UK working in equitable partnership with LMIC colleagues."
