The Pascoal Mocumbi Prize 2018 was awarded to Professor Souleymane Mboup. His career spans more than 35 years and has been dedicated to HIV-related research and lecturing at the Cheikh Anta Diop University of Dakar, Senegal and partner universities across the world. He and a research team discovered the HIV-2 virus. He initiated the construction of a state-of-the-art facility, the Institut de Recherche en Santé, de Surveillance Epidémiologique et de Formations (IRESSEF) in June 2017. His vision is to build IRESSEF into a modern platform for the promotion of high-quality research and training in Africa.

# Projects

## PROTID | project on diabetes and tuberculosis | January 2020

The PROTID study - Randomised controlled trial of preventive treatment of latent tuberculosis infection in patients with diabetes mellitus - is coordinated by Dr Reinout van Crevel (Radboud University Medical Centre, Nijmegen, the Netherlands). The project is funded by EDCTP with a grant of more than EUR 4.8 million and started in January 2020.

PROTID, will run from January 2020 until July 2024. The consortium "will be led by an experienced group of scientists and clinicians in the Netherlands, Uganda, Tanzania, United Kingdom and New Zealand. The first

study will take place in sub-Saharan Africa which is witnessing the fastest growth of diabetes globally, with the largest proportion of un-diagnosed and poorly-controlled disease."

Possibly a similar (separately funded) project is to be "conducted in Asia, which currently carries the highest burden of combined TB and diabetes. If proven successful, the outcome of these two studies may help improve global policy and practice regarding prevention and management of combined TB and diabetes.

## REMIND | vlog by fellow Dr Marion Sumari-De Boer | 13/02 2020

EDCTP Career Development Fellow Dr Marion Sumari - De Boer published a first vlog on her research and daily life and much more. Her fellowship is the REMIND-project, a study of the 'Effect of reminder cues and tailored feedback on adherence to antiretroviral drug treatment among HIV-positive individuals in the Kilimanjaro region, Tanzania'.

## TB-TRIAGE+ | project kick-off meeting | 15/02 2020

The TB-TRIAGE+ project had its kick-off meeting in Pietermaritzburg, South Africa, on 15 February 2020. The study - Community-based tuberculosis triage testing after symptom screening in hard-to-reach African populations: CAD4TB versus C-reactive protein (TB TRIAGE+) - is coordinated by Dr Klaus Reither (Swiss Tropical and Public Health Institute, Basel, Switzerland) with project partners in Belgium, Germany, Lesotho, the Netherlands, South Africa, and Switzerland.

## ASAAP | capacity development | 21/02 2020

The ASAAP project - a multi-country, multi-site clinical study to evaluate a new malaria triple therapy for children - is led and coordinated by Dr Oumou Maiga-Ascofaré of the Kumasi Centre for Collaborative Research in Tropical Medicine in Ghana. The objective of the project is the 'clinical evaluation of artesunate + amodiaquine + atovaquone-proguanil tri-therapy for malaria treatment in African children'. As part of the development of the required research capacity, the Malaria Research and Training Center (MRTC-Parasito) Bamako-Mali acquired on-site sequencing capacity. ## EACCR-2 | Update 2018-2019 | 24/02 2020

The <u>Eastern Africa Consortium for Clinical Research</u> is one of four EDCTP-funded Networks of Excellence dedicated to research capacity development in sub-Saharan Africa. EACCRE-2 is coordinated by Prof. Pontiano Kaleebu (Uganda National Health Research Organisation, Entebbe, Uganda). ## INTENSE-TBM | diagnosis training | 25/02 2020

The INTENSE-TBM project engaged in capacity building for TB meningitis diagnosis at the Institut Pasteur Madagascar. INTENSE-TBM - Intensified tuberculosis treatment to reduce high mortality of tuberculous meningitis in HIV-infected and uninfected patients - is funded by EDCTP (EUR 9.25 million) and coordinated by Prof. Fabrice Bonnet (University of Bordeaux, France). The consortium brings together institutions from Côte d'Ivoire, France, Madagascar, South Africa, Spain, and Switzerland.

## AMS UK | Interdisciplinary research in epidemic preparedness | 21/02 2020

The Academy of Medical Sciences (AMS) published a report on <u>Interdisciplinary research in epidemic</u> <u>preparedness and response</u> which is an output from the sixth policy workshop 'Multidisciplinary research in epidemic preparedness and response' organised by AMS in partnership with the InterAcademy Partnership (IAP) and the Medical Research Council (MRC) on 2-3 October 2019 in London, using funds from the Global Challenges Research Fund (GCRF). The workshop set out to explore the evidence required for effective epidemic preparedness, prevention and response, particularly in LMICs, and how interdisciplinary research can best be facilitated to meet these evidence needs.

EDCTP-funded <u>consortium PANDORA-ID-NET</u> is mentioned as an example of the needed interdisciplinary approach.

## ISGlobal | ivermectin roadmap | 22/01 2020

<u>ISGLobal announced</u> the development of an ivermectin evaluation and implementation roadmap. "A group of experts led by Regina Rabinovich and Carlos Chaccour from the Barcelona Institute for Global Health (ISGlobal) has published a roadmap to evaluate - and subsequently implement - ivermectin as a complementary vector control tool against malaria."

The Ivermectin Roadmap was published in the American Journal of Tropical Medicine and Hygiene.

## WWARN | Artimisin Molecular Monitor | Updated February 2020

"The <u>Artemisinin Molecular Surveyor</u> is an interactive map that summarises the prevalence of these molecular markers in the propeller region of the Kelch 13 gene of the malaria parasite by location and year, providing a clear and standardised visualisation of the evidence to date to inform key international, regional and national monitoring strategies."

## Lancet | TB vaccine development | 31/01 2020 (online)

Article published in *The Lancet infectious Diseases* : Lewis K Schrager, Johan Vekemens, Nick Drager, Prof David M Lewinsohn, Ole F Olesen: <u>The status of tuberculosis vaccine development</u>.

From the summary: "Epidemiological modelling suggests that, although drug treatments for tuberculosis continue to improve, WHO timelines to control the spread of the disease require a new vaccine capable of preventing tuberculosis, particularly in adolescents and adults"

EDCTP supported the drafting of the publication.

## Other opportunities

## GCRF | Networking grants 2020 | Deadline 31/03 2020

The Global Challenges Research Fund - a collaboration of the UK Academy of Medical Sciences, the British Academy, the Royal Academy of Engineering and the Royal Society - offers <u>Networking Grants</u>. GCRF is part of the UK's Official Development Assistance (ODA). This initiative aims to support cutting-edge interdisciplinary research that addresses global issues faced by developing countries.

Applications are invited from researchers affiliated to institutions in DAC-listed countries in collaboration with researchers within eligible UK higher education institutions (HEIs). Applications should focus on building a collaborative network. Therefore proposals should be submitted jointly by a lead overseas researcher from a developing country and a lead researcher based in the UK.

## MRC | Applied Global Health Research Board | Deadline 07/04 2020

The MRC (United Kingdom) has launched a new research funding Board and invites applications. The new Board will fund global health research that is embedded within local contexts in low- and middle-income countries (LMICs). Proposals should focus on ideas that will have real world practical application to improve health. Proposals are encouraged to be multidisciplinary. Principal Investigators in LMICs can apply directly to the Board without the need for a UK partner. Applications led by UK PIs must include LMIC co-applicants and be founded upon genuine equitable partnerships.

## Wellcome Trust | International Master's Fellowships | Deadline 14/04 2020

This scheme offers nationals of low- and middle-income countries the opportunity to receive training at Master's degree level. Who can apply?

- you are a national of a low- or middle-income country;
- your proposed research focuses on a health priority in a low- or middle-income country;
- you have sponsorship from an eligible host organisation in a low- or middle-income country.

## RSTMH | Small Grants programme | deadline 15/04 2020

This <u>annual Small Grants scheme</u> (up to £5,000) of the Royal Society of Tropical Medicine and Hygiene aims "to enable early career researchers and global health professionals in the field of tropical medicine or global health to undertake clinical or scientific research or fieldwork, as stand-alone projects or distinct elements within a larger project."

#### IMI | IMI2 - Call 20 | Deadline 21/04 2020

On 22 January, IMI launched IMI2 - Call 20 with funding opportunities in cancer, tuberculosis, vaccines, psoriatic arthritis and drugs based on proteins. The Call has a total budget of EUR 273 million. More information

#### ISGlobal | 2 Master's Fellowship schemes | deadline 05/04 and 14/04 2020

Students from sub-Saharan Africa can now apply to the ISGlobal scholarship programme to pursue the <u>Master in Global Health and</u>, for the first time, the <u>Master in Clinical Research</u>: International Health <u>Track</u>, for the 2020-2021 period. These scholarships cover the total of the tuition fees and the university taxes required for a complete registration programme.

The <u>Union Scientific Prize</u> "acknowledges researchers at any stage of their career for work in lung health published in the past five years leading up to the Union World Conference in which the award is presented." Nominations before **31 March 2020**.

#### AIGHD/WHO/EDCTP | TB Vaccine Roadmap Consensus Meeting | 03-04/03 2020

The Amsterdam Institute for Global Health and Development (AIGHD) in close collaboration with the World Health Organization (WHO) and EDCTP is organising a TB stakeholder meeting in Amsterdam on 3-4 March.

The meeting is part of a series of consultations to develop a Global Roadmap for the Research and Development of New TB Vaccines. EDCTP is funding this meeting as part of its support for TB vaccine development.

The Roadmap will define what clinical development, key capacities and policy and access measures would be required to deliver TB vaccines and ensure their public health benefit.

#### High-level dialogue on the EU-Africa Global Health Partnership | 16/03 2020

The EU-Africa Global Health Partnership is the intended successor to EDCTP2 under the next Framework programme for Research and Innovation, Horizon Europe. As part of the ongoing discussions and public consultation about the framework, a high-level consultative dialogue on the EU-Africa Global Health Partnership will be held on 16 March 2020, in Cape Town, South Africa. It is organised by the European Commission, the South African Department of Science & Innovation and EDCTP. Attendance is by invitation only.
