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Twelfth EDCTP Forum: celebrating global health research



The <u>Twelfth EDCTP Forum</u>, held from 15-20 June 2025, concluded with immense success, bringing together 1,214 participants from various parts of the world. With 71% of attendees from Africa, 26% from Europe, and 3% from the rest of the world, the Forum exemplified its commitment to fostering international collaboration in global health.

Over five energising days, the Forum facilitated:

- 8 plenary sessions featuring 45 distinguished speakers
- 15 parallel sessions showcasing 83 abstract presentations
- 18 scientific symposia and 6 sponsored satellite sessions
- 14 workshops and side sessions
- 186 posters highlighting innovative research
- 5 EDCTP Prize Ceremonies recognising outstanding leadership
- 36 Meet the Expert sessions that connected seasoned professionals with emerging talent.

A significant achievement of this Forum was the near gender parity achieved among participants, with women representing:

- 49% of plenary speakers
- 49% of Forum scholarship recipients
- 42% of total attendees.

While the discussions have concluded, the momentum continues as we look forward to the next Forum in 2027 in Madrid, Spain. We are excited to build upon the connections made and the knowledge shared during this remarkable event.

A Europe–Africa collaboration to strengthen health research



In September 2024, representatives from EU directorates and agencies involved in health, research, innovation, and international cooperation and development met to discuss the Europe–Africa collaboration to improve health outcomes across Africa. Despite progress, the continent faces challenges such as infectious diseases, non-communicable diseases, and antimicrobial resistance. The paper 'Europe–Africa collaboration: working together to strengthen health research, implementation, and equitable systems', published in *The Lancet Global Health* in June 2025, underscores the EU's commitment to the African region, stressing the importance of equitable partnerships that enable African stakeholders to lead in setting health priorities. Through strategic frameworks, such as the EU Global Health Strategy, and key initiatives like the EDCTP programmes, now in its third iteration (Global Health EDCTP3), and the Innovative Health Initiative (IHI), the focus remains on improving access to medical interventions and developing robust health systems.

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EDCTP Association celebrates appointment of Dr Delese Mimi Darko as Inaugural Director General of the African Medicines Agency



The EDCTP Association extends its warm congratulations to Dr Delese Mimi Darko on her recent appointment as the inaugural Director General of the African Medicines Agency (AMA). This significant nomination was made during the 2nd Ordinary Session of the Conference of State Parties (CoSP) of the AMA, held from 2-4 June 2025 in Kigali, Rwanda.

Dr Darko has led the EDCTP2-funded <u>BERC-Africa project</u>, which aimed to enhance regulatory capacity in Ghana. With over 30 years of extensive experience, she has made remarkable strides in the field, notably becoming the first female Chief Executive Officer of the Food and Drugs Authority (FDA) Ghana in 2017.

EDCTP Association at HERA Industry Days



Dr Pauline Beattie, Operations Manager and Scientific Advisor, EDCTP Association, was a panellist at the <u>Health Emergency Preparedness and Response Authority (HERA) Industry Days</u> held in Brussels on 2-3 June 2025. Dr Beattie presented in the session 'Driving innovation and collaboration for global health preparedness', describing how the EDCTP Association has strengthened research capacity and international collaborations in Africa through its funding for Networks of Excellence and Epidemic Preparedness Networks.

Strengthening clinical trial capacities in Lusophone Africa: training NRAs reviewers



From 9 to 13 June 2025, WHO-AFRO, through AVAREF, in collaboration with various partners, including the EDCTP Association, ANVISA, INFARMED, and ANARME, conducted its inaugural Portuguese-language training on clinical trials in Maputo, Mozambique. This significant event saw the participation of nineteen evaluators from six different countries, all of whom enhanced their skills in harmonised clinical trial assessments.

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EDCTP2 project news

ShigaPlexIM: SUNSHINE trial vaccination started in Zambia



The SUNSHINE trial, part of the ShigaPlexIM project, has commenced vaccination of participants living in Shigella endemic setting at the Centre for Infectious Disease Research in Zambia (CIDRZ). The SUNSHINE trial aims to assess the safety and immunogenicity of the InvaplexAR-Detox/dmLT vaccine against shigellosis. If successful, this vaccine could significantly reduce shigellosis globally, especially in vulnerable populations.

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Stool4TB consortium: final annual meeting



The Stool4TB consortium held its final meeting in Mbabane, Eswatini, at the end of May, concluding a 5-year study on a new TB diagnostic test using stool samples. Over three days, participants finalised the study's implementation and discussed result dissemination. Seven peer-reviewed articles have been published, with more results pending. PhD candidates George Kasule and Edson Mambuque presented updates, and members visited the Baylor Foundation Eswatini Tuberculosis Centre of Excellence. The meeting ended with plans for the project's legacy and a capacity-building session on R programming for junior researchers

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MTBVACN3: annual investigators meeting



The 3rd annual meeting of the MTBVACN3 project took place on 26-28 May 2025 in Baiona, near Biofabri headquarters, in Spain. MTBVAC is one of the promising tuberculosis (TB) vaccine candidates for newborns. The target is to vaccinate 7,120 newborns against tuberculosis during their first week of life.

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WANECAM-2 Consortium: Completion of recruitment for KALUMA study



On 29 May 2025, the WANECAM-2 consortium announced the successful completion of recruitment for the KALUMA study. This marks a significant milestone in their research efforts, with nearly 1,700 patients enrolled in the trial.

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PREPARED final conference: promoting equitable science during crises□



The PREPARED consortium has developed a global code of conduct for research during pandemics. This ethical framework supports researchers and ethics committees, adhering to the Declaration of Helsinki. Launched at UNESCO in June 2025, the open-access book includes guidelines, policy briefs, and training materials, with the aim of improving research ethics and integrity during crises.

The award ceremony occurred during the closing session of the Twelfth EDCTP Forum on 18 June 2025, and was presented by Ms Lara Pandya and Dr Jean Marie Habarugira, Co-Chairs of the Forum Organising Committee.

In his EDCTP-GSK Senior Fellowship, Professor George Boateng Kyei of the Noguchi Memorial Institute for Medical Research, University of Ghana, has not only



advanced the search for an HIV cure but also strengthened research capacity across Ghana and the broader African region.

Training and funding opportunities

2025-26 EDCTP COMPASS Fellowship Scheme | Deadline for applications: 15 August 2025

The 2025-26 EDCTP COMPASS Fellowship Scheme, a collaboration between the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine (LSHTM) and the EDCTP Association, offers opportunities for Master's programmes in Africa. It includes a two-year training component

leading to an LSHTM Master's degree in Clinical Trials or Epidemiology via Distance Learning and a policy or research-focused internship lasting 6 to 12 months. Candidates can apply for a full fellowship covering both components or a part-fellowship for either component. Host institutions for the internships must be in sub-Saharan Africa and involved in ongoing research with LSHTM. The deadline to submit applications is on 15 August 2025. LSHTM manages the selection and administration of the fellowship. More information »

MOHRE training programme | Deadline for applications: 31 August 2025

Applications are now open for the Master of Health Research Ethics (MOHRE) training programme at Universiti Malaya (UM) in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, set to commence in October 2025. This one-year, blended-learning Master's program is a collaborative effort between Universiti Malaya and the Berman Institute of Bioethics at Johns Hopkins University, with support from the Fogarty International Center, NIH.

The MOHRE programme is designed for professionals engaged in Institutional Review Boards (IRBs) and Research Ethics Committees (RECs), as well as researchers and academics with a keen interest in the field of bioethics. This unique opportunity aims to equip participants with the necessary skills and knowledge to navigate the ethical challenges in health research.

For exceptional candidates from low- and middle-income countries (LMICs) in Southeast Asia, scholarships may be available to facilitate their participation in this programme, with a deadline for scholarship applications on 31 July 2025. The general application deadline is on 31 August 2025.
